

WhiteBlaze Pages 2025 and Gaia GPS

Documentation for installing and using Gaia GPS in conjunction with the WhiteBlaze Pages PDF.

I will try to explain how to use Gaia GPS in conjunction with the WhiteBlaze Pages PDF Guidebook.

First off, Gaia GPS is not required if you just want to use the WhiteBlaze Pages PDF Guidebook.

Basic Gaia GPS is free to use. That is all that is needed for use with the WhiteBlaze Pages PDF Guidebook.

If you do not wish to use Gaia GPS then you will not need to continue with reading this document file. However you need to be aware that if you click on one of the coordinates in the WhiteBlaze Pages PDF Guidebook, it will try to open up Gaia GPS in your browser if you do not have the mobile app installed.

With that in mind you can use Gaia GPS in a browser but you will need to register with Gaia GPS and create an account to use it, it is free.

Gaia has some additional features that you can get for a reasonable subscription fee. None of those features are required to use with the WhiteBlaze Page PDF Guidebook. You can use the basic Gaia GPS package.

Getting registered with Gaia GPS.

You will need to get registered with Gaia GPS.

Go to (www.gaiagps.com) and create your account.

Once you have created your account you will be able to use Gaia GPS with your browser.

Getting Gaia GPS for your mobile device.

The mobile app is free for Android and iOS devices.

If you want to use this in conjunction with Gaia GPS on your mobile device without using it in a browser, you will need to download the Gaia GPS app to your mobile device.

You are not required to download the Gaia GPS app to use with the PDF. You will still be able to use the PDF in the browser, providing you have created a Gaia GPS account.

I recommend that if you are going to be using this on a mobile device for hiking, that you install the Gaia GPS app.

The reason for this is that once you set everything up correctly and put your device in Airplane mode you will not use any data off your mobile devices data plan.

Click on the correct icon below to install the Gaia GPS: Hiking, Off-road Maps app on your mobile device:

Downloading instructions

Open this link below on your "mobile device".

This is for an android, I believe the Apple OS is similar.

Once you have this link open on your mobile device you should see the following files displayed.

Press on each file one at a time and hold down until it is highlighted. Once the file is highlighted click on the three dots in the upper right corner and choose “OPEN WITH”. Pick Gaia GPS from the options. If you are ask you the question “OPEN WITH” and have a choice of “JUST ONCE” or “ALWAYS”, always pick “JUST ONCE”.

Do this same procedure with all the files.

Once this is done, you are all set.


Downloading instructions

Open this link below on your “desktop computer”.

This is for an android, I believe the Apple OS is simular.

Once you have this link open on you desktop computer you should see the following files displayed.



Click on each file one at a time and right click with the mouse.
Once you right click with the mouse, you should have the download option.
Download the file. Keep track of where your downloaded it to.

Do this same procedure with all the files.

Once the files are all downloaded open Gaia GPS and log in.

On the left side of the browser window click on the option to IMPORT DATA.

Now click on SELECT FILES.

You should be able to click on all 11 of these files and upload them all at once. If that does not work for you, upload them one at a time.

Once this is done, you are all set.
